Club Members have Excellent Results at 2006 US Open

Sacramento Chess Club members Michael Aigner and Daniel Schwarz recently competed at the US Open in Chicago, Illinois. Schwarz, by winning the 2006 CalChess K-12 Scholastic Championship, also represented northern California in the Denker High School Champions tournament held in conjunction with the US Open.

After eight long rounds, including the "Monroi Game" (you'll need to ask Aigner for the details), Aigner had 7 points, ½ behind tournament leader GM Shulman. With white against GM Fedorowicz and an early draw by Shulman, Aigner had a shot at first place. After a tough game, Aigner drew, finishing in a multiple tie for second place with 7½ points and clear first place for the 2200-2399 prize.

Schwarz had similar impressive results, scoring 7 of 9 points tying for 12th place and finishing tied for the second place prize in the 2200-2399 section. In the Denker tournament, Schwarz finished with 3½ out of 6, continuing northern California's strong representation in the tournament.

Congratulations to both Michael and Daniel for their success at the US Open!

Potential Changes to Club Meetings

The Hart Senior Center is trying to implement changes on our club meeting nights. Our meeting night renewal package included a desire to reduce the number of meeting nights each month to only the first four Wednesdays instead of every Wednesday. If this happens, the Club would not meet on any 5th Wednesdays. We are trying to work with the Hart Senior Center to keep all of our Wednesday night meetings intact. The Club has been meeting at the Hart Senior Center on Wednesday nights for over 20 years. Prior to the Hart Senior Center, the club met for many years at the club house in McKinley Park.

Starting in January 2007, we will be required to carry \$1,000,000 of liability insurance for our meetings at the Hart Senior Center. At this time, the most cost efficient alternative is to purchase the insurance through the City of Sacramento Risk Management Division for an estimated \$250 for 2007. The Club should be able to afford this coverage in the foreseeable future, but there is also a risk that the City of Sacramento will choose not offer this relatively inexpensive coverage for groups holding events in community centers.

These changes do not affect our ability to run regular and scholastic weekend events.

The United States Chess Federation has announced that the Sacramento Convention Center and Hyatt Regency Hotel will host the 2007 National Junior High (K-9) Championship on March 31 and April 1, 2007 (no joke here!). This will be an opportunity for all Sacramento area scholastic players to compete against players from across the nation. Be sure to set aside these dates and plan to play in the tournament.

The USCF has not contacted any of the local clubs or directors to learn about staffing for the tournament. The USCF organizers should make these contacts in upcoming weeks.

Discounts on USCF Memberships

The Sacramento Chess Club returns the USCF affiliate and on-line processing discount back to our members for memberships purchased on a Club night or as part of a transaction that would normally occur on a Club night. Sacramento Scholastic Team Tournament, October 28, 2006

EVENT: Four player teams in grades K-12 Open, K-6 Open, and K-6 U750 (average team rating must be less than 750). Each section must consist of 6 teams or sections will be combined. Team members do not have to be from the same school or club. However, schools and clubs are encouraged to enter multiple teams. Teams will be paired in a four round swiss system event. On each team, the highest rated player will be on board one and the lowest rated player on board 4 (unless another rating is available, all unrated players in K-6 U750 will be assigned a rating of approximately 600). All players must be current members of the United States Chess Federation (USCF). Non-members may join when they enter. The event will be run according to the USCF rule book and any modifications made for scholastic competition. A bughouse tournament will be held between rounds 2 and 3 for all players (balanced teams to be assembled based on round 2 pairings).

LOCATION: James R Cowan Fundamental School, 3350 Becerra Way, Sacramento. Directions: From Interstate 80 or Business Loop 80 in Sacramento, exit on Watt Avenue and go south. Go approximately one mile and turn left on Whitney Avenue. Go approximately ³/₄ mile and turn right on Becerra Way. The school is on the left near the end of the street.

ENTRY FEE: \$18.00 per player (\$72 per team) postmarked by October 21, 2006, add \$15 per player after October 21 and includes a Bughouse tournament between rounds 2 and 3. ½ point byes are available to each player and must be requested prior to the close of registration. Team entries (preferred method) will be accepted in advance or on site. Individual entries for teams will also be accepted (please include the names of other players and/or the team name). USCF Scholastic Membership \$19.00 (under age 15), Youth Membership \$25.00 (under age 19). If a player needs a USCF membership, please indicate on the entry form on page 7. The Sacramento Chess Club will post advance entries under the Weekend Events Info portion of it's web site (http://sacramentochessclub.org).

SCHEDULE: Check in & on-site registration: October 28, 8:15 to 9:00 am. Player, parent, and coaches meeting: 9:15 am in the tournament hall. Round 1: 9:30 am; Round 2: 10:45 am; Round 3: 1:30 pm; Round 4: 2:45 pm; Awards: Following the completion of Round 4. Time control: Game/30. Bughouse Quads: 12:00-12:45.

PRIZES: Trophies awarded to players of at least the top 3 teams in each section and highest scoring individuals on each board based on advance entries. Standard USCF tie-breaks will be used to break all ties. Players may win both a team trophy and an individual board trophy. Trophies will be awarded to each individual on the winning bughouse team(s).

OTHER: Bring chess sets and chess clocks! The ratings of players will be based on the October 2006 USCF Rating Supplement. Six teams will be required to fill a section or may be combined based on advance entries. This event is sponsored by James R Cowan Fundamental School and the Sacramento Chess Club. Food and drink on-site. If 1, 2, or 3 players do not have a complete team, send an entry form along with individual entry fees, and the Tournament Director will attempt to fill teams. Extra players who do not have a team will be provided a side event to play in.

2006 Sacramento High School Championship, November 18, 2006

EVENT: $K - 3^{rd}$ Grade, $K - 6^{th}$ Grade, $K - 8^{th}$ Grade, & $K - 12^{th}$ Grade sections. A team event will be held in each section (a team is a minimum of two students from a school or club in a section, minimum one team per event). All players must be current members of the United States Chess Federation (USCF). Non-members may join when they enter. The event will be run according to the USCF rule book and any modifications made for scholastic competition.

LOCATION: Foothill Farms Junior High School, 5001 Diablo Drive, Sacramento. DIRECTIONS: From Interstate 80, exit on Madison Avenue and head toward McClellan Air Force Base. Turn right on Hillsdale Boulevard. Drive approximately 1³/₄ miles and turn right on Diablo Drive. The school will be on the left, approximately ¹/₃ mile.

ENTRY FEE: \$15.00 must be postmarked by November 11, 2006. **SPECIAL ENTRY:** 1st time USCF Scholastic Membership (under age 15) and Entry Fee, \$29.00 **OR** 1st Time USCF Youth Membership (under age 19) and Entry Fee \$35.00; all must be postmarked by November 11, 2006. Entries postmarked after November 11, 2006, add \$15.00. \$2 discount to CalChess members is available. One ½ point bye is available to each player and must be requested prior to the close of registration. The best 4 scores from each team/club will be used and may be adjusted based on entries. Standard USCF tie-breaks will be used to break all ties. Advance entries will be used to determine total number of trophies to be awarded. **Players may win only one individual trophy.**

OTHER: Bring chess sets and chess clocks! Tournament Director (TD) reserves the right to not pair players from the same school in any or all rounds Late entries will be given a ½ point bye or be paired against another late entry at the TD's discretion. The Learning Exchange is in the building at the north end of the 1111 Howe Avenue complex, about ²/₃-mile on the right.
