### *Sacramento Chess School Continues!*

With the charging of rent to the Sacramento Chess Club at the Hart Senior Center, the Sacramento Chess School faced its own questions: pay rent or shut down. Bob Baker and Michael Parmon found another option: relocation. The Sacramento Chess School now meets at Burger King, 5300 Folsom Boulevard (corner of 54<sup>th</sup> and Folsom). Meetings are every Friday night from 6 to 9 pm.

### *Insurance for Club Meetings*

Since January 2007, the Club has been required to carry \$1,000,000 of liability insurance for our meetings at the Hart Senior Center. For 2008, the most cost efficient alternative was to purchase the insurance through the City of Sacramento Risk Management Division.

While we anticipated a fee of \$250 for 2009, the Hart Senior Center is now telling us we do not need this coverage. Club officials are trying to make sure this is true. Any savings on insurance will help the Club with rental charges.

**12-3 Quick Chess.** This will be a Game in 10 minutes, 5 round, USCF rated event. Registration 6:30-6:50, Round 1 at 6:55. Entry fee \$2.

**12-10 G/20 Octos.** Eight player, 3-round swiss sections, Game 20. USCF Quick Chess Rated, \$5 entry fee. Registration 6:30-6:50 Games start at 6:55. Sections will be ratings balanced and each section will have its own prize fund. Scholastic quads may be formed as needed.

**12-17 G/5 Double Blitz.** Unrated 4 round Game 5 double blitz tournament. Play both white and black against the same opponent. Entry fee \$2. Registration 6:45-7:05, round 1 at 7:15. If there is enough interest, a scholastic section may be formed. This event **WILL NOT** be USCF rated.

**12-24 & 31 Christmas Eve & New Year's Eve – the Club is closed – Have a happy holiday!**

**1-07-09 Sacramento Chess Club G/10 Championship Qualifier.** 5 round Swiss. This will be the qualifying round for the championship to be held on 1-14. The format: 21 or more entries, there will be three ratings balanced sections with the top two advancing to the finals from each section; if there are 20 or fewer entries, there will be two ratings balanced sections with the top three scores from each section advancing to the finals. Ties for advancement to the finals will be broken with a G/5 playoff. Registration 6:30-6:50. Games start at 6:55. Entry fee \$5. USCF Quick Chess rated.

**1-14 Sacramento Chess Club G/10 Championship.** The title will be determined by a six-player round robin with the qualifiers from 1-7. Any ties for the title will be broken using a G/10 playoff. USCF Quick Chess rated. Games start at 7.

**1-21 G/20 Octos.** Eight player, 3-round swiss sections, Game 20. USCF Quick Chess Rated, \$5 entry fee. Registration 6:30-6:50 Games start at 6:55. Sections will be ratings balanced and each section will have its own prize fund. Scholastic sections may be formed as needed.

**1-24 2008 Sacramento Elementary Scholastic Championship.** The flyer may be found on the Weekend Events page of the Sacramento Chess Club website.

**1-28 Winter Blitz.** Unrated 7 round Game 5 blitz tournament. Entry fee \$2. Registration 6:30-6:55, round 1 at 7. If there is enough interest, a scholastic section may be formed.

**1-28 Sacramento Chess Club Team Championship: Captains and Organizational Meeting** will be held between 7:30 and 8:00 pm. We need team captains to be there with the names of players on their team and individuals who would like to play but are not on teams. Team details below.

**2-4>?? Sacramento Chess Club Team Championship.** Round Robin. 6 person teams. No team may have more than 3 alternates. The average rating for any given night may not exceed 1750. For purposes of calculating the adjusted ratings, any player rated over 2200 will count as 2200; any player rated under 1300 and unrated players will count as 1300. Ratings will be based on the March 2008 Supplement. We encourage other clubs, schools, employers, or fraternities to

field teams. Clever names, logos, t-shirts, mascots, fight songs, etc., are all encouraged. No need to be subtle.

If you can't find a team, contact Bob Baker, or Steve Bickford at the Club; call John McCumiskey at 524-9479, or send an e-mail to us. You will be placed in a competitive situation as quickly as possible. Time control will be Game 55 d/5 or Game 60. USCF rated. Entry fee \$30 per team. Lineups must be placed in rating order. With TD approval, unrated players may be placed anywhere in the lineup, however, they must always play in the rating range of the players above and below them (i.e., if board 2 is rated 1904, board 4 is rated 1748, and an unrated player is placed on board 3, the unrated player must always be on a board between players rated from 1748 to 1904).

Trophies for the members of the winning team and best board score. (To win a board prize, a player must play 60% of the available games on that board. For example, if there are 5 games in the event, a player must play 3 games on a board to win the board prize.) We would like to see six to eight teams for this event! All rounds start at 6:55 pm.
